



Bivvy Cleaning

For cleaning technical fabrics such as those used in bivvys, we recommend the use of Universal Cleaner from Grangers.

Wash your bivvy whilst erect using warm water and a sponge - never scrub. Most of the time simply hosing down the bivvy and removing mud and debris with a sponge will be enough to prevent a build up.

Do not use detergents of any type. These will strip away the protective coating of the fabric.

We use the highest standard of zips we can source and in normal conditions they will provide years of trouble free service.

Periodically a zip lube may be used to ensure that they operate to the same high standard throughout the life of the bivvy.

However bank side conditions can get muddy so we recommend that zips get special attention keep the teeth free of mud as this can hamper the performance. This usually means the zip struggles to slide freely more often than not resulting in a forced zip that fails

NEVER FORCE A ZIP as this can cause permanent damage the teeth.

Again, take the time to dry the bivvy completely before packing the bivvy away
